I have heard Jesus' explanation of the judgement of the nations found in Matthew 25 referred to as the Great Compassion. In telling us to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, give drink to the thirsty, visit the sick and imprisoned, Jesus tells us "that when you have done it for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you have done it for me." The Great Compassion follows the Great Commandment to love God and our neighbor and the Great Commission to go and make disciples of all nations.

Your support of Lakeside's new Blessing Box and Lending Library are fulfilling Christ's Great Commandment and Great Commission with Great Compassion. As we gathered to pray over the Blessing Box and Lending Library Sunday morning after church, we encountered Sherry clutching a book tightly in her hand. After the gathering dispersed, Sherry shared with me that the book in her hand was written by one of her favorite authors, and how excited she was to be able to read it. She told me that she lives in the neighborhood and was grateful for the boxes that the church had put up.

After our Administrative Council meeting Monday night, another Lakeside neighbor who lives around the corner on Laurel walked up to the Blessing Box. I greeted her as I was getting in my car. Bonnie expressed her gratitude for the food that Lakeside is providing. She came home to an empty cupboard after being at the hospital with her husband all day. She selected a couple of cans for her dinner. I asked her what kinds of food might be helpful in the future. She mentioned ground beef but revised her suggestion to canned meals like Beefaroni, Vienna sausages or soup after realizing that we can not put perishable items in the Blessing Box. She thanked our church for providing the Blessing Box.

I believe that through your acts of kindness and generosity, Lakeside is becoming known as the church with a compassionate heart in our surrounding community. We are currently stocking the Blessing Box once a day. As word gets around of its location, I expect we will be needing to stock it several times a day. We need your continued support of the Blessing Box to ensure that we always have food for our neighbors as Jesus commanded.

Last week, Rosa Vargas and Geraldin Mondragon worked diligently to clean and rearrange a closet in the office to hold our food donations. Our closet can now hold larger quantities of food, including cases of items. I plan to purchase cases of Vienna sausage, Beanie Weenies and a couple of the Chef Boyardee canned meals. Let's see if we can fill our closet space for the Blessing Box with food for our neighbors! Additionally, perhaps we can all remember our neighbors the first Sunday of the month as we go to Christ's Table of Grace by bringing food and toiletries for our friends in need.

Hola, familia!

This Sunday's offertory anthem is "The Lord's My Shepherd, I'll Not Want", found in our UMH. The words are an old Scottish Psalter from 1650, in which the words of the 23rd Psalm are paraphrased. This psalter was set to music in 1872 by Jesse Seymour Irvine and the tune name is CRIMOND.

From 1936 onwards, this tune with the words from the 1650 psalter gained popularity, as the Glasgow Orpheus Choir used it frequently. It was also featured on two Royal occasions at the end of WWII: the wedding of Princess Elizabeth to Prince Philip at Westminster Abbey in 1947, and the silver wedding anniversary of King George VI and Queen Elizabeth at St. Paul's Cathedral in 1948.

I'm so pleased this tune is in our hymnal and I hope you enjoy it.
