It's a typical Arkansas summer. We've already had a couple of 100 degree days, and we have more 100 degree days ahead. In such extreme temperatures, our bodies require extra water. When we don't have enough water, our bodies, minds and spirits suffer. It is like that with our need for God. When we do not spend enough time with God, our bodies, minds and spirits can become dehydrated and begin to waste away. Psalm 63:1-8 reminds me of our desperate need for water and for God.

¹ You, God, are my God, earnestly I seek you;
I thirst for you, my whole being longs for you,
in a dry and parched land where there is no water.

² I have seen you in the sanctuary and beheld your power and your glory.
³ Because your love is better than life, my lips will glorify you.
⁴ I will praise you as long as I live, and in your name I will lift up my hands.
⁵ I will be fully satisfied as with the richest of foods; with singing lips my mouth will praise you.

⁶ On my bed I remember you; I think of you through the watches of the night.

Because you are my help, I sing in the shadow of your wings.
⁸ I cling to you; your right hand upholds me.

While I was in the Academy of Spiritual Formation, I was invited to write a Psalm in my own words. I chose the first part of Psalm 63. Using my own words to express my longing for a deeper and more intimate connection with my Creator, I released the river of living water that John says lives in each of us (John 7:38). During these warm days of summer, perhaps you might try your hand at writing a Psalm in your own words and release the river of living water within!

God, oh my God; I seek you, I need you.
God, oh my God; I can't live without you, be without you.
My feet wander with no path; I'm lost in time and space without you.

But I have seen you in the mountains – the rising mist at dawn.
Your glory has no equal, no equal. Your love is yet unknown,
But still you pursue, this love of yours endures.

Praise you Holy One: Father, Spirit and Son.
Praise you in the morning and evening and every breath in between.

Your Presence fills my being; I am complete and whole.
Holy are You God and holy is your name.
I am safe and secure in your unyielding hand.

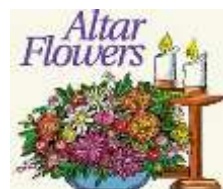
