Like every year, at the beginning of the school year Lakeside restarts the long-awaited Midweek Manna. Usually, this program correlates with the school calendar and is supported by the presence of some of our members who give of their time and are dedicated enough to make this program possible.

We start with a delicious supper at 5:30 pm, planned and organized solely by Sandy Bobo. The supper consists of an exquisite and balanced menu...like only Sandy knows how to do! This is followed by activities of the day which include tutoring for children kindergarten through twelfth grade. Here our voluntary tutors are challenged with helping the children with their homework or teaching them to read despite the language barriers. I am a true example of that effort. The Youth meet in the Youth Center on the second floor. This room is full of activities and much potential for teaching them to grow spiritually.

At the same time the parents of these families, principally the mothers, are invited to a class of activities. Our intent is to maintain the parents of these children and youth interested and actively involved in the lives of their children. Our hope is that these activities will promote family participation resulting in a joint experience of growing spiritually, together, as a family. The activities open with devotion and continued with basic cooking classes by "Cooking Matters", painting, crafting, sharing recipes, providing informative forums related to education, immigration, health insurance, and the like. Meanwhile, the small children enjoy our nursery.

It is not news to anyone that I came to this church through great people who offered assistance with my homework and helped me learn English. Myself and many others, now adults, are examples that this grand ministry works. Thanks to this program and its volunteers here I am today, writing you this article. Lakeside is the only church that I know that offers this ministry. Praise the Lord for that!

This year Wednesday, September 8th marks the beginning of Midweek Manna. We want to increase the number of individuals who participate in this program, both those receiving as those giving services. Today I ask for your precious time to continue changing lives. We have many opportunities to serve, in the kitchen helping to serve, to cook or to clean as in the nursery, assisting the little ones, tutoring, or serving the youth, and if none of this is for you...we also need a chauffeur and a companion to drive the bus and to pick up children.

If at some moment you feel the Spirit of God calling you to serve in this ministry...let Pastor Judy or me know. We will gladly share more details with you. We hope to hear from you soon!

Hola, familia.

I think we can all agree that we need our Lord's healing touch each and every day, and especially during these trying times. I know I need healing.

The offertory anthem for this Sunday, "When Jesus the Healer Passed through Galilee", reflects that need and reminds us of the mighty healing powers of God. Found in our UM hymnal (no. 263) this hymn was written by Peter D. Smith, and provides a compendium of many of Christ's miraculous healing activities.

Author, Peter David Smith, was born in Weybridge, Surrey, England in 1938. After working for a time in the aircraft industry, he became a Methodist minister.

A hallmark of his ministry was his gift as a folksinger. Though trained as a classical pianist, the folk guitar became his instrument of choice. Mr. Smith composed this song during a course he was teaching on contemporary worship.

Later, he served as an editor for the Partners in Praise hymnal (1979) and this hymn was one of ten contributions he made to the new hymnal. We are drawn into the narrative by the final verse, pointing out that the need for Christ's healing is still with us: "There's still so much sickness and suffering today....We gather together for healing and pray; Heal us, Lord Jesus!"
