A common question included in the interviews of new and provisional candidates for ordained ministry requires the interviewee to describe his or her understanding of his or her Methodist identity. While my love of our Methodist identity is too vast to include in this short article, one of the most meaningful parts of our identity is our open Communion Table. We believe that God's grace found in the sacrament of Holy Communion is available to all who seek Christ at this mysterious feast. We believe that God's grace is indeed sufficient for all.

In addition to God's grace found at Christ's Table, I also have a deep appreciation for our United Methodist connectionalism. Unlike congregational churches that depend primarily on each church's leadership and resources, the United Methodist Churches are connected at the local church, the district, the Conference and the international levels. The body of Christ in the UMC is vast and multi-faceted. It is a beautiful mosaic – connected by love and polity – commissioned by God to share the Good News and love of Christ with the world.

Our connectionalism begins with our own local Church: Lakeside UMC. Each fall we hold a Charge Conference to affirm the membership, ministries and vision for the church. It is an important meeting where the church considers the leading of the Holy Spirit over the past year and discerns the movement of the Holy Spirit in the approaching year.

This year our Charge Conference will be a Church Conference to consider some significant matters which are being brought before our church body. Rev. Edna Morgan, our District Superintendent and Mission Strategist, will preside at our Church Conference on Monday, October 4th at 6:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall. The Church Conference will vote on the following matters:

- 1) Sale of the property at 1501 S. Olive to church members Humberto and Ernestina Solis Beltran for \$20,000;
- 2) Adoption of the Single Simplified Board form of church governance for Lakeside;
- 3) Approval of new Lakeside Corporation officers;
- 4) Approval of our Charge Conference forms for 2021.

Come and be an active participant in our Lakeside United Methodist connection at our Church Conference on October 4th at 6:00pm in the Fellowship Hall. Let us celebrate what the Holy Spirit has been doing at Lakeside in 2021 and expectantly anticipate what the Holy Spirit will do through us in 2022.

Hola, mi familia!

This Sunday's offertory anthem is another Hispanic hymn from the UMH, "Una Espiga" (Sheaves of Summer). It was written by Cesareo Gabarain, a Catholic priest, born in the Basque country of Spain. (1936-1991).

As a composer, Gabarain became immensely popular worldwide, receiving a Gold Record Award in Spain when one of his albums sold 500,000 copies. At age 30 he focused only on hymn writing and wrote about 500 hymns, one of which is our favorite, "Lord, You Have Come to the Lakeshore", (also known as Pescador de Hombres, Fisher of Men) enjoyed around the globe by English and Spanish-speaking congregations. He tried to write songs that were easy to learn and be sung by the entire congregation. Gabarain was also a professor in the Superior School of Music in Madrid.

He died of cancer at the age of 55, and he accomplished so much during his lifetime. His hymns support moments of personal and communal prayer and praise to God. Gracias a Dios por esta vida.
