Hola, mi familia!

In selecting some music for this Sunday, I was posed a question: What songs can we sing that stretch us into the wonder that is our God? And I selected a suggested hymn for the anthem, "Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken".

It is a truly beautiful hymn and has an interesting history. The words were written by John Newton in 1779 and the tune was composed by Franz Joseph Haydn in 1797, an Austrian composer. Other lyrics were written in 1841 by August Heinrich Hoffman von Fallersleben of Germany.

Being a native Austrian himself, Adolf Hitler assigned this tune with its words as the German national anthem during the years of 1922 to 1945. After the reunification of East and West Germany in 1990, the tune by Haydn was officially adopted as the national anthem of Germany. Only the third verse written by von Fallersleben is sung, and the anthem is known as "Deutschlandlied". All other verses from von Fallersleben were dropped because of their inference and ties to Nazi Germany.

I hope you all enjoy this hymn for its beauty in praise of our God. "No one can contain You, God...no one can outshine You. No other one is Holy, no other one is full of righteousness."—Desperation Band
