It seemed as though we spent the whole day glued to our phones making call after call, motivated to find him a place to stay as we worked to find someone he knew to take him home or the destination for which he was heading. We found him temporary work, as well as a place where he could stay . After many hours of searching and worrying, we were able to contact someone he knew from Springdale, Arkansas.

Thank God for putting us in this situation at the right time and allowing us to be His hands and feet. Last Sunday afternoon, the man was reunited with friends and went on his way home.

Hola, mi familia!

In selecting an anthem for this Sunday, I noticed that the hymn I chose was written in the 1500's. (That's a really old hymn.) My next thought was, "what is THE OLDEST hymn in our hymnal?", so I looked it up. The oldest hymn in the UM hymnal is "Of the Father's Love Begotten", traditionally done at the first of Advent, so more on that hymn later.

This Sunday's anthem is "In Thee Is Gladness", which speaks to God strengthening us to give thanks even in times of sorrow. The words were written in 1598 by Johann Lindemann, a German composer, music editor and teacher. His work enhanced the social standing of music (music education) in the area of Gotha, Germany and he did much to foster in Italian music. He may have studied in Italy. Most certainly he had contacts there, in particular with Giovanni Giacomo Gastoldi, who wrote the music for this hymn in 1593.

Lindemann's significance is that he was one of the first to marry the Italian madrigal with the chorales of Germany. He did write a chorale with Gastoldi "In dir ist Freude" (from which our hymn comes) and it became one of the best known Protestant chorales. Nearly all of Lindemann's music is lost, though there are isolated hymns that remain.
