In considering the pastor's report for 2021, Paul's words in his second letter to the Corinthians come to mind: "7 But we have this treasure in clay pots so that the awesome power belongs to God and doesn't come from us. 8 We are experiencing all kinds of trouble, but we aren't crushed. We are confused, but we aren't depressed. 9 We are harassed, but we aren't abandoned. We are knocked down, but we aren't knocked out" (2 Corinthians 4:7-9).

Despite the challenges of Covid safety protocols for worship, Sunday school, Bible studies, children, youth and ministry opportunities, the people of Lakeside UMC have thrived. Small group studies, meetings and Coffee with the Pastor have been held on Zoom and in a hybrid format. Homebound members received a vehicle parade, weekly phone calls by the congregational care team, cards and treats to remind them that they are loved.

The caring people of Lakeside have continued to support our local food pantry, Neighbor to Neighbor as well as recently installing a Blessing Box and Lending Library on our church grounds. A Lakeside Christmas Drive provided children's Christmas presents for some of our financially challenged families. Lakeside's Mi Casa ministry has continued to provide monthly food distributions and oversaw the administration of a feeding and literacy ministry in Altheimer and Watson Chapel during the summer. Lakeside's heart for ministry to the community has grown and expanded over the last year.

Lakeside's leadership has made several forward-thinking decisions that further its mission to "make disciples of Jesus Christ who make disciples equipped to transform lives, communities and the world." In officially recognizing our Mi Casa ministry as an extension of Lakeside UMC, our leadership created a new position, Director of Missions and Family ministry. This position not only assumes responsibility for overseeing Mi Casa but also coordinates our volunteer support for our children, youth, and family ministries. This ministry has been responsible for our Easter Egg Hunt, Back to School Bash, and Fiesta de Colores celebration. Additionally, Lakeside's leadership recently decided to move to a simplified structure of governance beginning in January 2022 to more effectively engage in the ministry of making Lakeside's DNA of being the hands and feet of Christ in the community has resiliently found ways to express Christ's love in the midst of the pandemic. We will continue to discern the Holy Spirit's leading in the next year with specific attention to the ways we are being called to provide children and youth ministries. Through a collaborative partnership with a local Broadmoor Elementary school, we hope to further expand our Wednesday evening tutoring program to include on-campus literacy opportunities at the elementary school. Additionally, Lakeside deeply desires to be the home for Project Transformation when it comes to Pine Bluff.

Although the people of Lakeside UMC have experienced trouble, confusion, and harassment, we have not been crushed, depressed or abandoned because we know that our power comes from God.



As we acknowledge and celebrate All Saints' Day and Dia de los Muertos this Sunday, the choir has a beautiful anthem entitled "Devotion".

You will most definitely recognize the hymns that make up this piece, which speak to our longing to be close to our God and Savior, as was the longing of those who have gone before us.

I'm sure you noticed the great "a capella" singing from the choir last Sunday and you will hear more of that this Sunday. "A capella" is Italian, meaning "in the church (chapel) style", referring to the performance of multipart musical works by unaccompanied voices. This style of singing with no accompaniment reached its heights during the 16th century with the musical compositions written for the Sistine Chapel of the Vatican. But, this style is much older, dating back to the Hebrews and the early Christian church, where hymns and prayers were chanted, led only by a cantor. Singing without accompaniment is no small feat, requiring many skills from the singer(s).

I hope you will continue to enjoy the choir's endeavors. We are ALL blessed to have them.
