**From Rene'**



Hola, mi familia.

The prelude for our first Sunday in Advent is "Bist Du Bei Mir" (Be Thou With Me) by Johann Sebastian Bach. This exquisite piece has quite an extensive history. One of its first uses was as an aria in Stolzel's opera, "Diomedes", debuting on Nov. 16<sup>th</sup>, 1718.

One orchestra conductor claimed that "it was one of the most beautiful songs he'd ever heard".

It has been used very often for weddings and is also used often at Christmas, and many other occasions. I read a very moving account about a film which incorporated this music. "Joyeux Noel", released in 2005, was an epic war drama based on the time of the Christmas Truce of December 1914, during WWI.

At one point during the truce, documented as an actual event, Wilhelm, Crown Prince of Germany, sent the lead singer of the Berlin Imperial Opera company on a solo visit to the front line. He sang Bach's "Bist Du Bei Mir" to the regiments, and it led soldiers from France and Germany, and any opposing forces, in their trenches, to stand and applaud.

What a beautiful thought to hold in our minds and hearts as we begin our Christian year...as our thinking turns to the One who is to come, who will embody peace, forever.
