Lakeside has shown great interest in the ministry of food starting with the Food Closet that the Mi Casa office once had several years ago. This closet was rather small compared to what Lakeside is doing now. It was very similar to our very own Blessing Box and with the same purpose of 'feeding thy neighbor'.

Within the food ministries that Lakeside has had through the years are the Food Sacks that Rebeca Phillips prepared for several years. These bags included, among other items, cookies, fruit cups, and small tins of sausages to name a few. These bags were a great treat to whomever was hungry and came to our office asking for food.



Lakeside also adopted food distributions as a result of COVID-19. Thanks to the scholarships for which Mi Casa has applied, and the many monetary donations we have received from our Lakeside members, the food donations from St. James, and the Arkansas Food Bank, this ministry has

flourished. The distributions have become a symbol of Lakeside's love for its community. In my opinion, we are leaving our mark; we are no longer just another church now we are known as the church of Christ who loves and cares for its community. Last Friday, Lakeside showed out once again with its second food distribution of 250 units. We had 30 volunteers come and help pack units and 8 to distribute the units in the afternoon. Lakeside has already scheduled at least seven small food distributions for 2022, the first one being on January 12th and 13th. We hope to see you there!



Lastly, the box of blessings has successfully continued to attract many more people. The last couple of days our Blessing Box has demonstrated to be a true blessing for many families making it difficult to be kept stocked. We have a wonderful team of ladies who have been steadily helping to keep it full either with products already donated to our Food Closet or with items that they purchase and donate to the Blessing Box. Mi Casa has created a schedule to help keep this Blessing Box stocked, however, the schedule only covers Monday through Thursday of each week. With the upcoming holidays hopes are that anyone else who is willing and able will help keep the box full over the holidays.



When Mi Casa first started this ministry, we knew that we were changing a life or two, but never the way we have been the last year and a half. It's heartwarming to see the support and response to this ministry. If you haven't been able to be a part of it, we will be announcing particulars about upcoming opportunities.



Hola, mi familia.

I want to give you a hymn for Christmas from our Methodist hymnal. Found on p. 223, it's a hymn I learned years ago, but have never played for a worship service. The words and music were written by Johann Rist in 1641, and the harmony was penned by Bach in 1734.

The hymn is much more difficult for me to play as the years have progressed, but it is very beautiful. I will leave you with these beautifully intense words from the first verse:

“Break forth, O beauteous heavenly light, and usher in the morning;  
O shepherds, shrink not with affright, but hear the angel's warning.  
This child, now weak in infancy, our confidence and joy shall be,  
The power of Satan breaking, our peace eternal making.”
