Have the perky Christmas songs begun echoing in your head? Have you found yourself driving an extra block or two to check out a Christmas lights display? Have you delightfully added people to your Christmas card list or made extra Christmas goodies to share with friends, co-workers and family?

For many of us, Christmas is a time of gathering with friends and family; a time of decorations, gifts and treats; and a time of generosity that expresses the joy and love we have for the season and one another. It evokes happy memories of traditions continued and new ones adopted. It sparks the rekindling of friendships as well as welcoming new ones. Christmas can be a time of expectation, anticipation, wonder and delight!

But not everyone experiences Christmas this way. Debbie Owens' offertory prayer this past Sunday, prompted us to be mindful that not everyone is full of joy during this season. She prayed that God would call us to do and give all that we can for those who are hurting. The joy and wonder of Christmas often eludes persons who are experiencing loss, grief, loneliness and hardship. Whether these feelings of sadness and despair arise from the death of a loved one, a transitional stage of life, isolation or any number of other reasons, the felt pain and sorrow defy any hints of celebration. They shade Christmas blue rather than red, green, gold and silver.

One of the ways that God uses us to respond to Debbie's prayer is through Lakeside's Blue Christmas service. If you are not familiar with a Blue Christmas, or Longest Night service as they are sometimes called, please allow me to offer an explanation. A Blue Christmas service is a special time of worship for those who are grieving, lonely, or unable to embrace the excitement of the season. During this service, the worshippers' feelings of pain, grief, suffering, loneliness and confusion are acknowledged, and a safe space is created for each person to feel whatever emotions he or she may be experiencing. Like the Psalms of lament, the worship service moves from lamenting the current circumstances to entertaining the possibility of hope through God's presence to finally praising God. This worshipful movement includes prayer, Scripture, hymns and ritually lighting candles to remind us of the Light that comes into a world of darkness.

Lakeside's Congregational Care Ministers are assisting in planning and offering our Blue Christmas service on December 18th at 3:00 pm in the chapel. Prayer ministers will be available at the conclusion of the service for all who desire an extra time of prayer. Delectable treats, hot chocolate and an opportunity to linger and connect will be offered after the service as well.

This very special and holy time is one of my favorite services in the Christmas season because I so often witness the Holy Spirit's transformational moments and healing. This movement of the Holy Spirit even comes to those who are unaware of their need for it. Plan to attend if you need a little extra Holy Spirit boost this Christmas or bring someone whom you feel might be blessed by this special service.
