*From the Desk of Your Friendly
Neighborhood Musicologist*

I, much like Chaucer in the Retraction appended to his *The Canterbury Tales*, now prevail upon you for your mercy and understanding regarding the usual dissemination of biographical sketches and program notes for Black History Month.

I have, despite efforts to the contrary, have found myself more than usually assailed by the slings and arrows of outrageous fortune as of late, in addition to being slowed by senescence, infirmity, and demands of my time and attentions. To the limits of this season of his life I do yield, and adjust accordingly.

To that end, there will be only one article this year; its aim is more an overview of the month and the intent behind the selection of each piece rather than a deep dive into each work and its composer. To those who have come to enjoy the latter, I apologize. The desire to continue in that vein is certainly there, but I at present cannot provide them at the level to which you have become accustomed. I am unwilling to compromise on this; the work of this sort of education is too important, and you deserve the highest quality available.

Please know that if you would like to know more about anything you hear, you are welcome to stop me for a conversation or directions toward additional resources. I will do my best to accommodate.

The music slated for this month is meant to provide a cross-section of Black church music. Each work, apart from its primary goal as Offertory to provide at least a modicum of spiritual fodder through its text, showcases a unique facet from the canon of sacred works by Black composers and arrangers:

The month begins with Shelton Becton's (1953-) *All Good Things Will Be Added Unto You* (a trope on Matthew 6:33), and stands in the lineup as a more Gospel-infused anthem. A debt of gratitude is owed to Dr. D. A. Ford of First Presbyterian Church (Wheaton, IL) and Andrew Egbuchiem (a Nigerian countertenor now based in New York), who provided access to the scores for this piece.

This will be followed by *The Lord Is My Strength* by Samuel Coleridge-Taylor (1875-1912), very much in the Anglican/High Church style. Its text is drawn from Psalm 118 and *Hymns Ancient and Modern*. 2025 is the 150th anniversary year of Coleridge-Taylor's birth; Mrs. Ann Tibbs, our Director of Music, will provide an additional Coleridge-Taylor work at the organ in celebration of the milestone.

Closely related to the High Church style is the “art music” anthem *Guide Me and Lead Me*, by R. Nathaniel Dett (1882-1943). Its compositional style and duality of text (it was originally composed against the *Ave Maria* prayer) has allowed it to find a home in secular ensembles as well as Catholic and Protestant worship services. Mr. Barry Bates will sing its short recapitulatory solo in its final bars.

The month concludes with a more Spiritually inflected piece: Jester Hairston's (1901-2000) *Amen*, made famous by the Sidney Poitier-led *Lilies of The Field*. An arrangement based on the tune's final appearance in the movie has been especially prepared for Lakeside's Chancel Choir, and is slated to be conducted by Mr. Barry Bates.
