





A few hours before the snow began falling down all over Arkansas, I was listening to the late morning service at my church. In one of the preacher's points she reminded us that God will not put us in circumstances that he knows we cannot handle. Every trial in your life is because the kingdom of God is about to expand. I couldn't help but reflect on my life and recent events. I thought about last Sunday, the first of one of the year, and a phone call that I had received from my dad letting us know that he had been in an accident on his way to church. We quickly got ready and headed his way, not much was said during the 45 minutes it took us to get to exit 139A in Little Rock. No music, no typing away on a phone, or the typical whoosh of passing traffic. I was bothered not because of the lack of noise, tension, or even the accident. I was bothered at how abnormally calm I felt. My dad could have been hurt and I didn't feel scared or anxious, just calm.

My dad had told my mom the accident was just the car acting up and to just calmly make our way to him, but I knew that it was a wreck. We passed the icy road entering Little Rock and saw a piece of the vehicle's bumper. The officer that had responded to the call had taken my dad to wait for us at a Shell gas station right off of exit 139A, he was unharmed. We would have to go back for the car and pay the towing company but it was a problem for the following day. While he waited for an officer to show up, a semi truck driver had assisted my dad and offered him a warm seat while her mother offered him a hot coffee hoping to aid his nerves. Not sure I've ever been so thankful for two people I'll never know. It took me a week to realize that the only explanation for my calmness was God. It was so obvious, but it's so easy to forget even the simplest thing when everything around us seems to be going wrong. I heard someone say, "Sometimes God calms the storm and sometimes he calms his child in the rage of the storm."

In Matthew 14, we see Jesus walking on water and Peter being allowed to walk towards him. Peter didn't have any trouble until he focused on his surroundings instead of Jesus and let his fear overcome him. He lacked faith when it came to something that seemed impossible for him yet all he needed to do was trust.

"Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." Hebrews 11:1




Also, thank you to our bus drivers and side-kicks who go the extra mile to get our Mid-Week Manna children each week.
