I'm not sure why I am finding it is so difficult to write a newsletter article this week. Perhaps it is because I can't find the words to speak of the hope and promise of a new year. Maybe it's because I'm reluctant to confess my excessive dependence on books and new practices to bring me renewed inner peace. Perhaps it's because despite a meaningful journey to Bethlehem and an enchanting Christmas Eve service, my heart is still heavy with the weight of dissension and division raging through our United Methodist Church.

I find myself lamenting with brothers and sisters in Christ who are grieving the losses of church homes, church families and historical church identities. Some are wondering where they will be married, baptize their grandchildren or bury their loved ones. The feelings of disorientation and rejection are not unlike those that Mary and Joseph must have felt as they sought a place to stay in Bethlehem and then as they took flight for their lives to Egypt when warned in a dream of Herod's plot to kill Jesus.

Times of transition, like the beginning of a new year or a new chapter in our family or spiritual lives, hold grief and loss alongside hope and promise. Even long awaited and anticipated transitions hold the loss of the familiar and comfortable. Sometimes we have difficulty recognizing the gifts of hope and promise until we have fully embraced the truth of our grief and loss. I believe I struggled with this article because I wanted to jump over the puddles of pain on the path of possibilities and hope. I wanted to escape my sadness with not one or two, but *five* daily devotional books for 2023! I wanted to deny my soul sickness by using a daily lectionary Bible study and reading the Bible in a year.

While all these practices, in and of themselves, are good, it is the deep soul work of acknowledging our losses from the changes in our lives that brings the spiritual transformation we seek. Trevor Hudson, a United Methodist pastor in South Africa, describes each of us sitting beside our own pool of tears. Although each of our pools of tears are different and were collected through different experiences, our tears hold the possibility of change and growth, transformation and resurrection. The Lord does not promise us that we will never experience pain and suffering, but the Lord does promise to be with us every moment as we experience the ups and downs of life. One of my favorite passages that I cling to in times of sadness and times of joy comes from the weeping prophet, Jeremiah. *"I know the plans I have in mind for you, declares the Lord; they are plans for peace, not disaster, to give you a future filled with hope. ¹² When you call me and come and pray to me, I will listen to you. ¹³ When you search for me, yes, search for me with all your heart, you will find me."* (Jeremiah 29:11-13)

Will you join me in this new year praying to experience God's presence and seeking God's future filled with hope as we are transformed in Christ together?
