However, there are many families within our neighborhood and our community who are hoping to receive some help with the ever increasing costs of everything, including school supplies. This is where Lakeside comes in.

School supplies, uniforms, shoes, backpacks are just some of the necessities each child has to begin each school year. I am glad to belong to a church which is always aware of the needs of its neighbors, goes above and beyond to serve and provides more than just the basic needs. We want to provide the school supplies required by actual grade levels as posted by the classes of the schools in our neighborhood and communities where the needs are the greatest.

This event was a huge success last year. We had around 200 individuals attend, including children, parents and volunteers. Considering that last year was our first year to go big, it was very well received by everyone who chose to be involved in big or small ways. This year, we hope to do much more. We must start thinking about the event early, consider every aspect that could be beneficial to the families such as 'tax-free' dates, and make all necessary plans in order to be better prepared for this event. So, I ask each of you to mark your calendars as we will hold our 2nd annual community Back to School Bash on Sunday, July 31st from 5:00-7:30 p.m. With your generous support I believe we can make this happen again!

The school supplies that we will be giving out will be managed differently this year. More about that in our next newsletter. While volunteers are our greatest asset, we must face the fact that we are not like the movie minions that seem to multiply without effort. Please, consider inviting your friends from other churches, your unchurched friends, and your family members, to join us in this effort.

Similar to our Trunk-or-Treat, we will have trucks with games. Each truck owner will be responsible for creating a game and Lakeside will provide the prizes that will be handed out. We will be setting bouncy houses with adult supervision for the safety of the children. Tables will be set up for greeters, drinks, and popcorn.
