Below is the testimony that Sissy Jones gave before the Lakeside congregation on November 13, 2022. It is being printed here for the benefit of all who did not hear it in worship. Thank you Sissy and the Jones family for your love of Lakeside UMC and your continued faithfulness.

Good Morning,

I asked Reverend Judy to let me speak because I want to share my witness to a recent Holy Spirit nudge and offer a challenge to our congregation.

During a time of recent hospitalization, Reverend Judy visited me. She listened as I expressed concern over several situations in my life. After praying with me and reminding me of my need to trust God, she said to me, "Sissy, God's got this." I haven't forgotten those words, "God's got this." I've witnessed God working out several things in my life over the last couple of weeks.
