












The present circumstances in the United Methodist Church have recently prompted many Methodists to ask why they are United Methodists. As a result, both laity and clergy have shared the reasons they are United Methodists in such venues as #BeUMC and #ProudtobeUMC. These heartfelt sharings offer words of encouragement for many who are suffering the loss of their beloved church homes and also provide hope of a future UMC that continues to offer Jesus' hospitality of welcoming and sharing his love with all people.

Although I walked this path of exploration, questioning and self-examination a number of years ago, I want to share with you some of the reasons I am United Methodist. I could tell you that I am UM because both my father's and mother's families were Methodists, or because I was baptized and confirmed in the UMC or because I have participated and led small groups, worship, retreats and ministry events in the UMC. And although these things contributed to why I am UM, they are not the reason that I am UM.

I am UM because of God's ever-available, persistent grace that invites us throughout our faith journeys to draw ever closer to the God of the universe and of our hearts. I am United Methodist because John Wesley's Scriptural Way of Salvation (creation of humanity in the *Imago Dei*, sin, repentance, justification and sanctification) is exactly how my belief and faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior happened. I am UM because when I became curious about the Holy Spirit, I learned that United Methodists come from a long line of believers in the power of the Holy Spirit – people who surrendered their lives through the practice of spiritual disciplines to align their wills with the Holy Spirit.


But perhaps two of the most powerful reasons I am UM are the Lord's Supper and Sanctification. We believe the grace of Jesus Christ meets all people – without exclusion – at Christ's table of Holy Communion. We believe that Christ's grace works in those who receive the bread and the cup in ways we may never know or understand. We also believe that God's sanctifying grace continues to work in us throughout our lives after we accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior. We believe that God never gives up on us reaching Christian perfection in this lifetime but continues to offer us grace to grow more like Christ through the spiritual practices of prayer, fasting, Scripture study, worship, Communion, and service to others.

Our United Methodist theology of both/and rather than either/or compels me to both listen to Christ's words and observe Christ's actions in Scripture. It stretches my faith to both listen to my Christian brothers and sisters who think differently from me and to be open, pray and discern how God is using them to speak into my life. Because at the end of the day, Jesus Christ's ultimate desire is that we live into the kingdom of God on Earth as it is in heaven.

Called Church Conference Monday, October 10th at 6:00 pm

You may recall that last fall, our church voted to move to the simplified plan of governance. Our church committees – finance, staff parish relations, trustees and administrative council – were combined into our Leadership Board. Each member of the Leadership Board, with one exception represents each of the committees. According to the Book of Discipline, our lay leadership committee (nominations) remains separate. Initially, we chose to keep our Endowment committee separate until the church had a better feel for how the Leadership Board would operate. The Leadership Board is a success except for the difficulties and delays inherent in having to consult the Endowment committee on pertinent issues.

Your Leadership Board believes that it is in the best interest of conducting the timely and orderly business of the church to make the Endowment Committee part of the Leadership Board as well. Each member of the Board will become a member of the Endowment Committee in addition to the other committees.

A change to our system of governance requires a charge or church conference vote. Please plan to attend our called church conference on Monday, October 10th at 6 pm in the Fellowship Hall.

Summary of September Leadership Board Actions

After Sandy Bobo opened the meeting with prayer and Gerald Majors led a devotional on the importance of the responsible use of our financial resources in maintaining our relationships with God, our community and the church, the following business took place:

- The consent calendar, consisting of the Memorial report, August minutes, Trustee report, and Missions and Family Ministry report were adopted.
- The financial report reflecting that Lakeside is approximately \$35,000 under budgeted income and recognizing that utilities have been unexpectedly higher this year was adopted. It was noted that income is often low during the summer months. Income is hoped to offset the arrearages in the 4th quarter, as it often does.
- A new Safe Sanctuary / Safe Gatherings policy was adopted in compliance with the new Conference Safe Gatherings policy. A Safe Sanctuary / Gatherings Coordinator will be identified in accordance with the new policy.
- The Leadership Board voted to move the Endowment Committee under the authority of the Leadership Board and to hold the necessary Charge Conference.
- Lakeside's annual Charge Conference reports were approved with several minor changes.
- Fred Reed presented two proposals of \$168,000 and \$125,000 for needed maintenance in cleaning and waterproofing the outside of the church as well as interior repairs and painting of \$20,000 due to water damage. Further consideration will be given to the matter at the October meeting.
