Do you ever feel like something is missing in your life, but you don't quite know what it is? You run through your mental checklist of activities, interests, and responsibilities and find that everything checks out; but you still have this sense that something important is missing. It's a constant yearning that descends into the deepest part of your soul and is ever so slowly growing louder and more persistent, like the grumbling of an empty stomach.

While on vacation last week, I had the opportunity to visit Blanchard Springs Caverns. The beauty of the caverns was mesmerizing as I tried to imagine the slow continual movement of water that carved and created the natural wonders I beheld. While the cavern was well lit, many areas were beyond the reach of the lights. The dark felt ever so dark. In some strange way that perhaps only the Holy Spirit understands, the darkness beyond the lights spoke to the emptiness in my soul. It was not as if the darkness was immutable to the light, only that the light did not reach it. After 2 ½ years of the cavernous darkness of Covid, perhaps it is time to invite the light of Christ into the depths of our souls to heal and restore us.

Perhaps by now, you are thinking of a passage from the Bible, such as John 1:5. *"The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness doesn't extinguish the light."* Or perhaps Psalm 139:11-12 has come to mind. *"If I said, 'The darkness will definitely hide me; the light will become night around me,'¹² even then the darkness isn't too dark for you! Nighttime would shine bright as day, because darkness is the same as light to you!"* Each of these Scripture passages holds the comfort and promise of God's healing power of light and presence in our lives. But how does God's healing light find its way into the dark depths of our souls?

The light of God's sanctifying grace is always available to us; however, we must accept and immerse ourselves in it. I realized in my first couple of meetings with the Young Disciples that the deep yearning I was experiencing was the desire to draw closer to Jesus. With a little self-reflection, I discovered I had been in survival mode trying to first maneuver the tumultuous waters of Covid and now the division within the United Methodist Church. Like the Young Disciples, I was craving a closeness with my Savior that had slowly and silently ebbed away.

The Young Disciples are beginning a spiritual journey of study known as Companions in Christ which is rooted in the Wesleyan spiritual disciplines of Scripture study, prayer, holy conferencing, worship and service. They have committed to reading the material each week and participating in the daily journaling exercises on their journey of growing closer to Christ.
